Who are we?

- A local careers education charity, established in 1992 to support schools and colleges across the city and the county with careers education
- Make a link between education and business
- We provide a variety of services to schools, one of which is Work Experience
- Last academic year we helped to organise over 5,000 placements for young people

Why do work experience?

- Provides knowledge of the local job market and starts students on the road to building a network of business contacts
- An opportunity to impress local business people in a few years' time there
 may be the opportunity to go back to the same manager seeking
 employment! Maybe a part time job?
- Valuable experience to add to a CV or Personal Statement
- Many employers are happy to offer a reference, which students can use when applying for jobs, either while they are still at school or later on

Softer Skills...

- Provides students with an insight into different sectors and careers
- Gives them the opportunity to use and apply their skills and knowledge in a professional environment
- Aids the development of 'employability skills' -that are required not only in the workplace, but in life. These include communication, working with others and problem solving
- Builds confidence and self-esteem by showing students what they can achieve outside school
- Allows students to 'try out' an area of potential interest

Skills for the Future Study – Work Readiness

Only 1/3 of businesses in the survey rate the work readiness of young people recently recruited as 'excellent' or 'good'. Their main concerns appear to be:

- Communication/conversational skills
- Business/sector knowledge
- Unrealistic expectations
- Work ethic/timekeeping
- The ability not to give up when faced with challenges (i.e. resilience or grit)

Student Feedback on Work Experience...

- 84% reported a rise in confidence
- 82% stated their communication had improved
- 90% felt their ability to organise was better
- \bullet 86% felt more equipped to make a positive contribution to the work place
- \bullet 97% said they had a better understanding of rights, roles and responsibility in the workplace
- 95% had a better understanding of the importance of health and safety
- 85% developed new skills, and were motivated to work harder in school

When will work experience happen?

How do LEBC support with work experience?

- Support students by finding suitable work placements using our bank of employers
- Undertake a Health, Safety and Welfare visit with employers to:
 - Ensure the relevant insurance is in place
 - Produce a detailed job description
 - Create a risk assessment document
 - Formulate work experience paperwork

The work experience process

- Students to complete an application form (pages 1 and 2)
 - Making realistic 1st and 2nd choices (use student directory)
 - Establishing travel areas wider travel increases chance of 1st choice being found
 - Providing LEBC with as much information as possible
- Parents to sign back page to confirm you are happy with the form

Self-Placements

- Students can choose to secure their own placements
 - The Self-Placement form is needed along with the main application form
- Benefits of this include being able to access placements LEBC can't such as the NHS, Uniformed Services
- The student directory identifies areas where self-placements are recommended
- Work experience is there to test students and to promote independence – we don't recommend that students go to work with relatives

There is a cost to work experience

- Costs of Placements:
 - LEBC Placement = £57.00
 - Self-Placement = £50.00
- Forms to be returned by 27th October 2017 to Miss Spencer
- Payments to be charged via your school bill
- All forms and support documents will be made available on the school website
